Lk 1,67-79 - Let yourself be touched

67 And John's father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, saying,

68 "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David,

70 as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,

71 that we should be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us:

- Have you ever let the Holy Spirit "grab you" and talked enthusiastically about Jesus or God? How was it? If not, was something holding you back? What?
